- Pay monthly Co-op fees (\$20 for the first child and \$10 for each additional child with a cap
 of \$50/family).
- Pay any extra fees for classes like music and cooking as appropriate.

Greenbriar School is a private school located on 174 acres in rural Bastrop County between Elgin and Bastrop, TX. Curriculum is created each semester based on students needs. It is loosely based on the free-school model of education. All are welcome and tuition is always affordable. Currently classes are offered on Tuesdays and Wednesdays.

Greenbriar School was part of the free school movement spreading throughout America during the 1960's and early 1970's. The initial coalition of parents and teachers secured 172 acres of wooded land between Bastrop and Elgin, Texas and establish Marsalom Inc. in 1969 as a non-profit organization to run the school they named Greenbriar.

Although the undeveloped land held no modern amenities, the founders were enthusiastic and industrious. They drove out early to work on the schoolhouse waiting for the students to arrive, taught classes until the students left, and headed home late after continued work on the facilities. The efficiency of camping out on the land soon became apparent and the Greenbriar Intentional Community was born.

At Greenbriar School, we believe in the intrinsic curiosity of children. It is our goal to cultivate that natural desire for learning and to encourage passion and creativity.

We provide an ever-changing curriculum of classes inspired by the students' interests alongside the basic subjects of reading, writing and arithmetic with a heavy emphasis on being in nature.

Our teachers are passionate about the education of the students and dedicated to the achievement of our goals. Many have degrees in education, making it a lifelong commitment, while others have skills in subjects the students have asked for and have volunteered to share their knowledge.
