Salado Museum and College Park - The Salado Museum and College Park was established to preserve and promote the pioneer history of Salado and the diverse nationalities that settled the area. College Park, just south of the museum, is the location of the ruins and grounds of historic Salado College. 423 S. Main St., Salado, TX 76571.

Pace Park

For fun lovers, Pace Park is a lush greenery space in the heart of Salado. It is a place everyone wishes to escape into and enjoy a quiet time or bond with family. Tablerock Amphitheater

The Goodnight Amphitheater at Tablerock serves as both a gathering place for the Salado community and an outdoor venue for stunning original plays and musical performances. Every summer, the amphitheater hosts annual shows of the acclaimed play "Salado Legends." Stillhouse Hollow Lake

Stillhouse Hollow Lake is located near the Fort Hood Army Base, which has several points of interest for the military buff. Tour Chalk Ridge Falls Environmental Learning Center located below Stillhouse Hollow Dam. The Center includes a hiking trail along the Lampasas River, a spring-fed creek with a waterfall, and several wildlife viewing points.



Visit the Gault Site

Before white settlers came to Salado, Indians were the primary occupants of the city, hunting and camping along the freshwater streams. During that time, the Gault Site, a 75-acre archeological treasure seven miles southwest of Salado, provided a site that displayed physical proof of Indian artifacts. This site was discovered in 1929 and was one of the central areas of operation for the Clovis people of North America. Some of the relics in Gault Site are as old as 14,000 years. It was also believed that the Clovis were nomadic mammoth hunters and the first to enter America. The Gault Site has remained a historic center, producing over a million artifacts.



Barrow Brewing

The tap room and beer garden at Barrow Brewing Company are the perfect place to hang out with friends, meet new people, and try local craft beer in Central Texas. As the first microbrewery in Bell County and only brewery in Salado, Barrow offers you an opportunity to peer directly into the brewing area and have the full craft beer experience. Barrow Brewing Company is family-friendly and hosts a variety of events- everything from yoga to scientific seminars.
